
# National Moot Court Competition (NYC Bar Association)





- More information available in the fall problem is not released until early spring semester 2026


# HOWDOIJOIN?

### Eligibility

- o Teams are open to all rising 2Ls and 3Ls
- Preference will be given to 3Ls with Sherman-Minton or other oral advocacy experience
- You can apply as a team or as an individual


## 2Ls must enroll in B642: Appellate Advocacy

- o 1 credit hour, Pass/Fail-- No final exam or paper
- Combination of lecture and video presentations
- o 2 practice arguments
- Writing exercises
- Learn about appellate review, the specifics of brief writing, and a lot of "nuts and bolts" skills for written and oral advocacy.



# Plan ahead

- Moot Court takes time!
- Most competitions will involve work over winter break.
- Assume that the three weeks before argument will be *very* busy.



# One hour of academic credit

Participants can enroll in B734 (External Moot Court Team) for one hour of academic credit.

Additional credit hours may be available through directed reading or directed research with affiliated faculty.
